



- Evidence of good understanding of challenges and opportunities_(use of data and intelligence)
- Ability/willingness to benchmark_areas locally, regionally, nationally and beyond (effective use of data, partnerships, networks)
- Sound understanding of what levers they can pull to influence their economy (factor conditions, skills, education, public economy, engagement with business, picking up the pieces, facilitator etc)
- A strategy which explains how they plan to use these levers to develop their economy and effective implementation (clear narrative)
- Opportunistic to make the most of opportunities as they arise, but
 opportunism does not dominate (how use funding and manage inward investment)

- Evidence of understanding of the synergies_between economic development and other services/organisations and activity to capitalise on these links (eg LSP commitment, housing, procurement, health)
- Evidence of positive outcomes
- Flexible/adaptable to reflect changing context/circumstances_(awareness of changing/failing markets, responsiveness, partnership)
- Reflective , opportunities to evaluate , challenge and learn from previous experience (evaluation activity, performance framework, views of staff)
- Effective economic development activity is not necessarily proportional with the size of the economy, nor the size of the challenges
