

# Achieving lasting impact: learning and resources

This paper provides links to some resources about various aspects of sustainability and lasting impact, at different stages of a project life-cycle and for different types of projects.

## **BIG definitions of sustainability**

Our research paper <u>Early indications of sustainability at the Big Lottery Fund</u> defines sustainability as the continuation of the benefits and/or activities of projects once BIG funding has ended, dependent on the nature, objectives and context of individual projects. These included:

- the continued use of facilities provided as part of capital investment projects
- new services developed and delivered as a result of BIG funding
- the use of skills developed among project beneficiaries and project staff
- the establishment of new or strengthening of existing partnerships and other collaborative working arrangements
- sustained behavioural change among individuals
- contributing to the body of knowledge of effective approaches to meeting a range of needs even if this knowledge was not utilised immediately.

This paper goes on to review in detail factors that are important for sustainability, in planning, delivery and in interacting with the external environment. <u>Click here</u> to read more.

## **BIG** Research: Learning from the Healthy Living Centre programme

The evaluation of the Healthy Living Centres (HLC) programme in 2007 included a focus on sustainability. There are some useful insights in the evaluation for grant holders and for BIG to continue to reflect upon, whatever stage they are at.

Significant factors contributing to sustainability in HLCs included:

- Designing for sustainability from the beginning
- Owning buildings versus strong networks
- Approach to health inqualities
- Access to future funding by lead agency
- Partnerships
- Fund-raising and entrepreneurial staff
- Supportive attitude of the local statutory sector
- Flexibility and staff to take advantage of opportunities in the wider environment
- Support by BIG to networking and share good practice
